### Letter from the Chair

I am delighted to welcome readers and friends of North Berwick Trust to this fifth edition of our newsletter. This bi-annual update on Trust news is published in the summer and winter each year.

Over the last year, the Trust's Grants Group has been working to deliver additional funding opportunities for our town's community groups and residents in need as demand increases. Recently, the Trust successfully completed our autumn general grants round and over £1.4 million has now been awarded in grants since 2018. A multi-year funding option was available for the first time, designed to provide longer term security for projects. I was delighted to see multi-year grants awarded to four key longer-term projects within our town.

The Trust's Young Person's Scholarship also awarded its first grants this year to support 3 young people with their ambitions. Read more on Page 3. A separate funding stream for capital grant projects up to £100,000 was also launched this summer - applications are welcome at any time for this fund. Read more about our latest grants on page 2.

Like all North Berwick residents, the Trustees of North Berwick Trust were shocked by the extent of the damage done to the harbour by the recent storm. With the expected help of the Scottish Government, East Lothian Council and others, the Trust will stand behind the Harbour Trust in its efforts to strengthen the damaged wall and to restore the harbour to its former condition. As an interim step, the Trustees have agreed

that a previous grant of  $\pounds$ 30,000 should immediately be diverted to fund emergency measures to protect the harbour from further damage.

The Estates Group have been forming closer links with our local schools. Law Primary pupils enjoyed visiting the orchard at North Berwick Trust Park. Pupils have been learning how to care for our town's first community orchard. They have even come up with a name! The Trust has also moved forward with its plans to improve the 'triangle' of Trust land near to Law Primary. ### **Autumn 2023 Grant Awards**

In our most recent grants round, the Trust awarded £167,188 to support 15 projects, as listed in the table below. This is the Trust's most oversubscribed round to date, with a high number of quality applications. As usual, the projects are very diverse and will benefit a wide cross-section of the community. Grants of up to £32,000 are available for projects which meet the criteria and one or more of the Trust's funding themes. Projects have up to 2 years to claim the funds. Applications are divided between 'Level 1' which is up to £3000 and 'Level 2' which is up to £32,000.

This round was the first time a 'Level 3' was available; multi-year grants where funds of up to £32,000 are available to draw down each year for 3 consecutive years, giving a total maximum grant of £96,000. Fringe by the Sea, Herbspace, Law Out of School Network and North Berwick Youth Project were all awarded 'Level 3' grants to provide longer-term financial security for their projects.

## Young Person's Scholarship: First Awards Granted

North Berwick Trust were delighted to award three young people from North Berwick a total of £14,000 at our September board meeting.

The scholarship is especially designed to assist our young people age 14–25 years old to move their life forward in a positive way and to progress their careers. The scheme is open to those who live or study in North Berwick. Priority is given to those who could not afford to pursue their ambitions without support. The types of projects the Trust will support include further education or career training and those with specific ambitions in sport, music and art or other cultural or creative endeavours. This was the first-time scholarships have been awarded. The Trust was delighted to support a university student with commuting costs, a school leaver pursuing a career in aviation and a young surfer on his way to the World Junior Surf Championships in Brazil. 15-year-old surfer and North Berwick High School student, Charlie Pugh, was thrilled when he was selected to represent Scotland, 'It was an amazing experience being able to compete on the world stage against the best of the best! I felt I surfed well and was able to contribute to the teams' overall points haul. Team Scotland finished in 27th place out of 47 countries which is a fantastic result that we were all very proud with. I came away with lifelong memories of the best surfing experience and made lots of new friends along the way!'

'I'd like to say a massive thank you to the North Berwick Trust for helping to make the recent trip to Rio possible for me. It was such an honour to represent Scotland in the ISA World Junior Championships in Brazil'.

# Plans for Trust's 'triangle' Progress

The Trust has moved forward with its plans to improve the 'triangle' of Trust land near to Law Primary; with a detailed specification being developed and prices from suitably qualified requested contractors. The closing date for this tender process is early January 2024, and we are hopeful that works will commence in the spring. The Trust continues to be supportive of the pump track development; and has agreed to accommodate this facility within the 'triangle'.
